A successful site visit was held at Southampton General Hospital on 28th April who are now open and actively looking for patients.

The first part of the site initiation for Basingstoke was also held on the 28th April and a site initiation for Wycombe is planned for early in May.

Site set up has begun at two new sites: Worthing Hospital and St Bartholomew's Hospital bringing our total to 32 sites including all open and those in set up.

Congratulations to Edinburgh who recruited April's lucky number! A box of chocolates is on its way to Belinda, Miles and the rest of the REVIVED team.

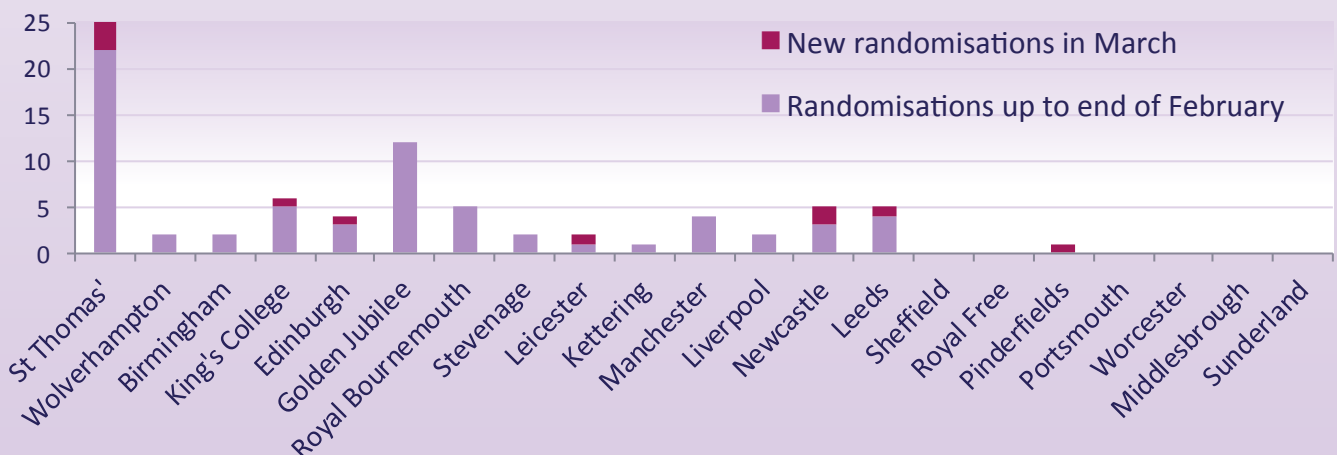
This month's lucky number is 88

It is appreciated how much work it is to complete these every month, however it is very valuable data so a compromise solution has been agreed with the Trial Steering Committee. Every six months a 'snapshot' of screening for that particular month will be requested, beginning in October 2015.

Patient sources—April data

As you may have noticed if you recruited a patient over April, a survey has been conducted of all randomisations and where they were originally identified. Thanks to all of you who contributed to this. Over the next few months we hope to build up a picture of the most successful methods for identifying patients across all of the sites.

The data collected so far is summarised in the table to the right. As April has been our best month ever, there is already some information to report and as we collect additional data this will become a useful and generalisable resource to help sites make the best use of time spent identifying patients.

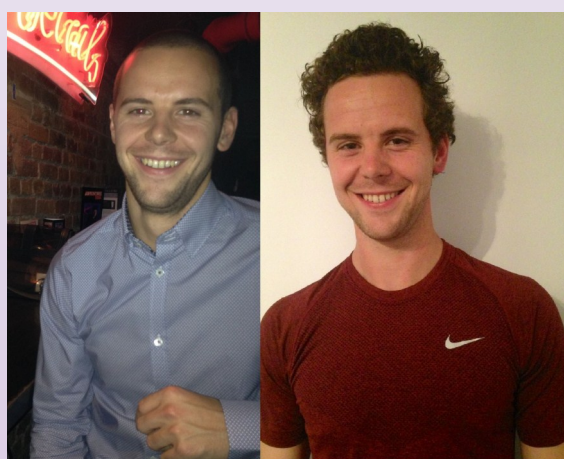
